- a) Define the following terms (3 marks)

- d) State six responsibilities of a first aiders (3 marks)

- f) Outline the analytical frameworks that can be used to identify the risk factors for road traffic accident (3 marks)
- g) A wasp stings a child's hand, explain the interventions you will provide (3 marks)
- h) You assess a casualty and you determine that airway obstruction is apparent. What are your possible interventions (3 marks)
- i) Critique the trimodal death pattern in trauma and emergencies (3 marks)

- j) Identify three (3) advantages and three (3) disadvantages of helicopter transport in emergencies (3 marks)

QUESTION TWO (20 MARKS)

A 63 seater bus headed to Kisumu from Mombasa stumbles on a stationery track on the road without warning sign at about midnight. The driver immediately brakes swerving dangerously before hitting the edge of the track and the bus rolls over five times killing a number passengers on the spot.

- a) Analyze the crash and associated crash factors and the integrated preventive approaches for such crashes (10 marks)
- b) Leading your team you arrive at the scene, describe how you will proceed with triage of the casualties (10 marks)

QUESTION THREE (20 MARKS)

- a) You arrive at a scene of landslide where you are leading a team in excavating the casualties. Explain how you will size up the scene. (10 marks)
- b) You find a non-responsive casualty by the road side with a few by standers wondering the next course of action. Describe your response to this incident. (10 marks)

QUESTION FOUR (20 MARKS)

- a) Respond to a fire incident involving three casualties in a burning house. You can hear screaming from inside and hitting at the door that grows faint by the minute. (12 marks)
- b) Describe the actions you will take to rescue a drowning child in a pool's deep end bearing in mind you are not a good swimmer. (8 marks)

QUESTION FIVE (20 MARKS)

- a) A casualty in your care following a blunt abdominal trauma without any visible tissue damage complains of dizziness and begins to gradually lose consciousness. What is the possible outcome of the injury and how will you intervene to save the casualty's life. (10 marks)
- b) You are part of the emergency response team in a war zone. Evaluate the type of injuries you are likely to encounter against the emergency response services required. (10 marks)
