QUESTION ONE (30 MARKS)

- Highlight 7 sites that can be recognized as sacred site (7 marks)

QUESTION TWO (20 MARKS)

- Tourism contributes to a wide range of issues that undermine the quality of life of local residents. Such issues include intrusion on daily life, loss of privacy, and a sense of crowding among others. Propose seven ways through which the negative impacts of tourism on culture can be mitigated (14 marks)
- Examine 3 risks that are associated with successful non authentic attractions like theme parks, casinos, water ways parks which are majorly found in the urban areas. (6 marks)

QUESTION THREE (20 MARKS)

- a) It has been said by a number of authors that World heritage sites are significant to a tourism destination since they in some cases lead to increased publicity and increase in visitor numbers. However, this is not the case in Kenya as some of our heritage sites for instance Lake Turkana National Park, Mt. Kenya National Park, Lamu Old town and Mijikenda Kaya Forests are less popular than other sites not in the heritage list, for instance Masai Mara national reserve, Lakes Nakuru and Naivasha, the coastal beaches among others.
